Olive Harvesting 2022

New Norcia's olive harvest is underway and 'so far so good' – yields and quality appear to be high (the first load yielded 11.4%).

With the grounds team currently understaffed, lan and Shady, as well as the monks, were grateful to receive extra help to pick and sort the olives, by way of both mechanical and extra boots on the ground.

MercyCare's Employment Pathways help refugees and asylum seekers to identify their skills and interests and match them to available work opportunities. New Norcia was fortunate to receive two of their people, llshat from

Kazakhstan and Yohannes from Eritrea, Africa. Ilshat's wife, Ilnuf, also helped in a volunteer capacity. We were very grateful for their help.

This year we purchased an OliNet, an aid used for harvesting olives with folding arms and a trunk sealing system. Olives were picked both by hand and with mechanical olive rakes, collected in the suspended net, and funnelled into storage tubs. It proved to be fast and reliable to setup and made harvesting more efficient.

We look forward to welcoming you to New Norcia before the year's end.



New Book Releases

Fr. Robert Nixon has two new translations available, both released by prominent USA publishers. *St Benedict's Bones: A Medieval Monastic Mystery* documents the complex saga of the mortal remains of St. Benedict and St. Scholastica. Shortly after Benedict's death, his monastery at Monte Cassino was destroyed by Lombard invaders. It was at that point that one of the greatest mysteries of medieval monasticism arose - the true location of the mortal remains of this revered saint and his sister. This volume presents the first English translations of the key medieval texts relating to this famous and fascinating mystery. A translation of a 13th-century version of the life of Benedict is also included in the volume.


Meditations on the Holy Angels is the only major work written by the popular saint, Aloysius Gonzaga, presented now in English for the first time. This 16th-century Jesuit saint died at a very young age, but his sanctity and innocence won for him widespread devotion and veneration. This inspired treatise, written shortly before the saint's



death in his early twenties, offers insights into the wondrous role of the angels (including Michael, Gabriel and Raphael, and the guardian angel) in the lives of all Christians.

Fr. Robert's translations of *The Crown* of the Virgin by St Ildephonsus, and Humility and the Elevation of the Mind to God by Thomas á Kempis have also been released as audiobooks, available through Amazon and other outlets.



Mandorla Art Award at Holmes à Court Gallery

Australia's most significant thematic Christian art prize opened on Saturday 21st May, at Holmes à Court Gallery in West Perth. The Award has attracted some of the nation's finest artists since it was first established in 1985.

This year, of 275 submissions, 41 artists from across Australia and WA have been selected to exhibit. All artists submitting addressed the 2022 theme of Metamorphosis, with a biblical reference to Isaiah 43:19 - "I am about to do a new thing; now it springs forth, do you not perceive it?"

The \$25,000 major St John of God Health Care Prize winning work will become part of the Mandorla Collection, held in perpetuity at New Norcia Museum and Art Gallery and displayed in its Mandorla Gallery.

This year the selection panel included ECU Honorary Professor Ted Snell, artist Susanna Castleden and Notre Dame University theologian Associate Professor Glenn Morrison. Judges of the award are John Curtin Gallery Director Chris Malcolm, artist Erin Coates and theologian Rev Ros Fairless.

Franz Liszt (1811-1886) is often regarded as the greatest pianist of all time, and his work set new standards of technical virtuosity which remain unrivalled even to this day.

He was also a strikingly original composer, imaginatively transforming the styles of his time into a completely new idiom. His Catholic faith was central to his life, and he wrote numerous works inspired by religious themes, becoming a Franciscan in his later years.

This recital by New Norcia's Fr Robert Nixon will present a varied selection of Liszt's music, including all his most popular pieces, and also recount the amazing story of his life.

The evening will commence at 6.30pm at the New Norcia Hostel. A light supper and drinks will be served. Tickets are \$90, all inclusive.
