Congratulations Nora and Brian from all your New Norcia family, and welcome to Ava and Isaac, the two newest members of the parish!




Christmas in **July Dinner**

Ilth July Solemnity of St Benedict.

This was our day to celebrate the life of our Holy Father Benedict.

There was a community morning tea at 10:00am attended by the monks present on site, oblates, quests and staff.

Father Robert travelled to Perth to celebrate mass for New Norcia oblates at the Redemptorist monastery in North Perth. The Redemptorists were very generous in inviting Father Robert to celebrate their normal morning mass, and for that to include the oblates of New Norcia.

There were about 60 people at mass, including 13 New Norcia oblates. Following the mass, the oblates then had a meal together

in a local restaurant and enjoyed catching up with each other and recent happenings at New Norcia.

Evening vespers were a solemnity for our Holy Father Benedict, followed by a barbecue dinner with the monks, oblates and two monastery residents.

Meanwhile, back at the monastery the monks followed a special timetable, which included:

Olive Oil Judges Training Day


The West Australian Olive Council (WAOC) conducted a training session by Isabella Okis, Chief Judge for WAOC, for existing judges and 6 new applicants who were keen to learn the intricacies of EVOO on Sunday 6th August in the Olive Shed.

Approximately 20 people attended the training which required the participants to taste 6 individual oil samples in small blue containers. The reason blue containers are used is that it does not allow the judges to eliminate an oil because of its colour.

The judging is based on the following points:

- 1st Oil should be at room temperature of 28 degrees,
- 2nd Flavour
- Complexity of the oil, does the oil 3rd taste of fruit or tomato

A talk was delivered by Dr Monica Kehoe from the Department of Primary Industries and Regional Development on the Xylella fastidiosa, which is a bacterium that slowly chokes olive trees to death.



The Xylella fastidiosa has spread through other olive producing counties such as Spain and France. The only control is the removal of the affected trees and a safety zone around the remaining grove.

There is no evidence that this bacterium is in Australia at this time. This may be attributed to Australia's strict quarantine practices.

Lunch was a Spanish style meal of fresh salads, olive oil, cold meat and fresh bread, tables and chairs were moved out from the olive shed and into the small grove.

We envision that this monastic presence will continue to evolve and adapt as it owns the negative aspects of its past, assesses and deals with the difficulties of the present, and faces the opportunities, uncertainties and challenges of the future, and that it may be enriched by encouraging new vocations, our oblates, and those who desire to live and work beside us.

We envision New Norcia to be a place of:
