The hidden God whom we seek

On Sunday 22nd September, we were pleased to welcome our dear friend and oblate Chief Justice Peter Quinlan, who served as retreat master for the annual monastic community retreat.

Aware of Peter's theological/philosophical grounding, and his deep spirituality (nourished in the past thirteen years by the monastic tradition) Abbot John invited him to give the retreat, the first time someone other than a priest or religious has done so in the history of the New Norcia community. Our small community was enriched with the presence of Sr Raphael Stone OSB, Sr Lilian Bong SJA, and our resident volunteers Jim and Chris. Our friends Chris, Phil and Jason also sat in on a few sessions during the week of silent reflection.

Drawing on the Scriptures, the Rule of St Benedict, the Divine Office, his favourite authors such as Flannery O'Connor, and his own personal and professional experience, Peter offered two conferences each day on the theme 'The hidden God whom we seek.' It was a very contemplative retreat full of wisdom and insight. In this present time in which the church is focusing on Synodality – a time of attentive listening to all members of the Body of Christ – the retreat was indeed a profound example of 'synodality in action.'

We kept the tradition of ending the retreat silence with a 'picnic day' at the conclusion of this special time in the monastic year, enjoying a lovely lunch together at the Victoria Hotel in Toodyay.
