Rock of Remembrance

At the conclusion of Mass on Sunday 25th October, we were pleased to bless the newly installed 'Rock of Remembrance' – an interactive memorial in honour of those who experienced any form of neglect or abuse at New Norcia.

Situated next to the Abbey Church, the memorial serves as a permanent acknowledgement and apology, in the hope that it will contribute to a sense of healing and reconciliation.

The text reads:

"God, you are the rock where I take refuge; my shield, my mighty help, my stronghold." Psalm 17 (18):2

This 'Rock of Remembrance' is a memorial to people who have experienced neglect and abuse.

Unearthed from this ancient land, it represents the steadfast love of God who created all things and holds them in being. Laid out in the form of a cross, symbolising the cross of Christ, it represents the hope of new life beyond pain and suffering.

The Benedictine Community of New Norcia has installed this memorial in acknowledgement of and sincere apology for the physical, emotional and sexual abuse suffered in this place.

You are invited to spend a moment in silent thought and prayer, and to take a pebble adding it to the memorial as an expression of your support for these people, that God will grant them peace of mind and heart.

The blessing coincided with the Catholic Religious of Australia (CRA) annual 'National Day of Sorrow and Promise', and the annual reunion of the New Norcia Aboriginal Corporation.

The Benedictine Community of New Norcia continues to work tirelessly to do everything it possibly can to ensure a safe environment for all those who engage with the site.

Ecumenical Carols Service

The 28th Ecumenical Carol Service will be held in the Abbey Church on 2 January 2021 at 5.00 pm.

The service features community carols for all to sing, plus carols sung by the Georgian Singers, led by John Beaverstock. The New Norcia service is the second of two carol services sung by the Georgians each year. The first is the Service of Nine Lessons and Carols, which takes place on the Monday before Christmas at St Patrick's, Mount Lawley. The Georgian Singers have sung at every Ecumenical Carol Service since it was first held in 1994. Over the years the choir has sung well over a hundred different Christmas carols and settings of other seasonal music.

The New Norcia Carol Service is a celebration of the seasons

of Christmas and Epiphany. It was developed by Rev Anthony Bolt when he was Rector of Holy Trinity, York, and on his retirement the service moved to New Norcia. The theme of the service is carried through the lessons which tell the story of the appearance of the angel Gabriel to Mary, Mary's visit to her cousin Elizabeth, the birth of Jesus, the visit of the shepherds and the journey of the wise men, ending with the well-known passage from the beginning of St John's Gospel that tells us that "The Word became flesh".

The service has an ecumenical focus, and Rev Kathy Barrett-Lennard, former Rector of the Anglican Parish of Wongan Hills-Dalwallinu, presides at the service jointly with Abbot John. The service is preceded by afternoon tea at 4.00pm in the Monastery Parlour – to which all are invited.
