






New Norcia Calendar 2013 Now Available

New fire truck for New Norcia





New Norcia Bush Fire Brigade recently took possession of its *latest* fire fighting appliance. This replaces the old 2:4U single cab tanker which was a re-furbished unit from DEC (previously CALM)

The Shire of Victoria Plains latest appliance is an Isuzu 3,000 litre, 4 wheel drive tanker with a crew cab featuring the latest technology and communications system. Capable of carrying a crew of six comfortably, it features a water delivery system capable of maintaining constant pressure without dangerous pressure increases, when working with multiple hoses.

The additional equipment on the fire truck will enhance the New Norcia Bush Fire Brigades fire fighting capabilities as well as having the ability to protect the historical town of 'New Norcia' adequately.

Captain, Gavin Halligan and the volunteers were on hand to run through the truck with officers from DFES. Gavin hoped that they wouldn't have to use it in the foreseeable future, but agreed they were more than ready to respond.

Victoria Plains, Community Emergency Services Manager, Vicki Booth said the new appliance will enhance the Shires fire fighting capabilities and is a great result. It now means that the shire is now well equipped to deal with fires when they occur.

Abbey Church landscaping


A new garden and lawn have been established in front of the Abbey Church. The majority of the landscaping works was undertaken by GK Landscapes, Gin Gin. The excavation and removal of the overburden and supply of the sand base (200 tonnes sourced on the property) was undertaken by the Buildings & Grounds Department with the assistance of the farm manager, Peter Grainger, and some of his staff. The project forms part of the Landscape Masterplan and was funded as part of the Year One Lottery West Grant. Reticulation to the area forms part of the network supplied by the NN catchment reservoir to the south east of the town. It is envisaged that a second row of olive trees will be planted parallel to the landscaped areas in 2013.

New Norcia Studies Journal launch 20th Edition

Thursday 8 November was the day scheduled for the launch of this year's *New Norcia Studies Journal*. For a number of years this event has been generously hosted by the City of Subiaco, first at the Subiaco library and in recent years at the Palms Civic Centre on the corner of Rokeby Road and Nicholson Road. Archivist Peter Hocking liaises with the Subiaco Council, the monastery's Archives, Research and Publication Committee invites a prominent person to do the launch and invitations are sent out both by standard mail and email. The person invited to launch the Journal this year was the doyen of West Australian historians, Professor Emeritus Geoffrey Bolton AO. The event saw attendees arriving between 5.30 and 6pm, usually needing the cold water or fruit juice on offer after a hot day, greeting friends and acquaintances and enjoying the flute and violin duo whose music enhances the occasion.


Abbot Bernard Rooney, representing the Abbot of New Norcia, Dom John Herbert, welcomed those attending, and introduced the Mayor of Subiaco, the Honourable Heather Henderson. The Mayor spoke as might be expected about the historical link between New Norcia and Subiaco. Fr David, a member of the ARP committee, then introduced Professor Bolton, who proceeded to give a stimulating précis of the contents of this year's Journal which he then officially launched, encouraging those present to purchase their copies there and then. Peter Hocking's wife, Jackie, and her sister very kindly assisted Peter with the sale of the Journal on the night. Special acknowledgement was paid to the editor who carried out her task almost entirely by email contact with the writers of the articles and the printers from her home in the United States. The whole event went very smoothly, a good number of copies of the Journal being purchased while a slowly diminishing number of guests stayed on enjoying each other's company, the wine and NN bread and oil until everything was packed up and all left the venue at 8pm sharp.

New Norcia Christmas Opening Hours

The New Norcia main office will be closed from Monday 24th December until the 1st of January, reopening on Wednesday January 2nd 2013.

St Gertrude's Fire Escape Project

The St Gertrude's Fire Escape project forms part of the Year One Lottery West Grant. The two replacement fire escape stairs (North & South elevations) provide for a greater egress capacity ratio than their predecessors. Both stairs incorporate three extra landings which facilitate a significantly less steep gradient resulting in a much more secure path of travel in the event of an evacuation. Cays Engineering, Greenfields, Mandurah undertook the design, fabrication, delivery and erection of the fire stairs.

Part of the installation process required the landing outriggers to be pinned through the fabric of the building. This necessitated the removal of a number of sections of pressed metal cornices to facilitate penetrations through the walls in order to affix the internal steel plates. The removal and reinstallation of the cornices required very delicate handling and was undertaken on behalf of BCNN by Charles John, Moora with the assistance of Shane Gilmartin, NN Buildings & Grounds. The overall project, from fabrication to installation and commissioning, was undertaken in a very timely manner and came in on budget and on schedule.


Guesthouse update


